Chronology

1875

Born March 22, St. Louis, Missouri, first son of Richard Levy Miller and Esmerelda Story.

1891

Enrolls at Washington University School of Fine Arts, St. Louis (probably night school).

1892

Enrolls at Washington University as full-time student.

1895

Awarded Wayman Crow Medal (for most satisfactory progress during year), Silver Medal (best work in life class), \$15 (best work in portrait class), and Teachers' Scholarship, St. Louis School of Fine Arts. Exhibits in 12th Annual Exhibition, St. Louis Exposition and Music Hall Association (also 1896, 1897).

1896

Exhibits with St. Louis Association of Painters and Sculptors (2nd annual, May), St. Louis Museum of Fine Arts (also 1897).

1897

Awarded Gold Medal (best work in life classes), St. Louis School of Fine Arts. Exhibits with Society of Western Artists (2nd annual, January), St. Louis Museum of Fine Arts.

1898

Gets job as illustrator, (St. Louis) *Post-Dispatch*. Exhibits at St. Louis Artists' Guild (also 1902–03, 1936).

1399

Travels to France (awarded scholarship funds for study abroad, Art Student Association, St. Louis School of Fine Arts). Enrolls at Académie Julian, Paris, studying under Jean-Paul Laurens and Benjamin-Constant (April 17, 1899 – May 7, 1900). Has same address as Lawton Parker: 9 Impasse du Maine

1900

Receives 3rd Medal for *Portrait (At Her Devotions)* at Salon, Société des Artistes Français (Exhibits also in 1901, 1903–1914) Exhibits for first time at Art Institute, Chicago (also 1901, 1903–05, 1910, 1912, 1914, 1918–1919, 1922, 1923, 1925, 1928, 1930.) Summer travel to Brittany; paints outdoors.

1001

Receives Bronze Medal, Pan-American Exposition, Buffalo, New York. Address: 5 rue Boissonade, Paris.

1902

Back in St. Louis. Instructor, St. Louis School of Fine Arts. Begins exhibiting at Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts (also 1905, 1908–1928, 1933).

1903

Returns to Paris. Address: 14 rue Boissonade. Miller joins Clarks, Aid, Frieseke and others to Chartres to see Paris-Madrid automobile race, May 23.

1904

Receives 2nd Medal at Paris Salon, conferring hors concours status at future exhibitions. French government purchases one of Salon entries: Les Vieilles Demoiselles. Awarded Silver Medal, Louisiana Purchase Exposition, St. Louis.

1909

Exhibits Sixth International Exhibition of Art, Venice (also 1907, 1909); L'Exposition Universelle et Internationale de 1905, Liège (2nd medal); Lewis and Clark Exposition, Portland, Oregon. Member: International Society of Sculptors, Painters and Engravers, American Art Students' Association, Paris Society of American Painters, Felix Club (London), St. Louis Artists Guild. Chief instructor at Ecole Colarossi, Paris. Miller gives Portrait (At Her Devotions) to Washington University (now in private collection).

1906

In St. Louis, May 1e–September 15, painting portraits of civic leaders.

190

Gives summer instruction to art educator Mary C. Wheeler and her students in Giverny. Marries Harriet Adams, November 6, in London. French government purchases *Vieille Hollandaise*.

1908

Made Knight of French Legion of Honor. Returns to America with wife for summer visit, includes St. Louis and Scranton, Pennsylvania. Municipal Council, Paris, purchases *The Toyseller*. Exhibits triennial Salon, Royal Museum of Fine Arts, Antwerp, which purchases *The Old Woman*.

1909

Birth of daughter, Elsbeth, June 18. Travels to Italy, summer. Exhibits in special gallery with Frieseke at Venice Biennale. Modern Art Gallery of Venice purchases *Il Bagno*. Begins exhibiting at National Academy of Design (also 1912–1920, 1923, 1934, 1943). Exhibits with St. Louis Society of Artists (also 1910).

1910

Summers in Giverny. Exhibits with "Giverny Group" at Madison Gallery, New York City, December. Member, Paris Jury, Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts (PAFA) 105th Annual Exhibition (also 1912–1913). Exhibits at City Art Museum, St. Louis (also 1911–1915, 1922–1924, 1928); Corcoran Biennial (also 1912–1941); Carnegie Institute (also 1911, 1913–1914, 1920–1926). Second Vice-President, Paris Society of American Artists (also 1911).

1911

Awarded Temple Gold Medal, Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, for *The Chinese Statuette*. Italian government purchases *Lady with a Fan*, from International Exposition of Rome. Summers in Giverny. French government purchases *La Toilette* from Paris Salon for Luxembourg Museum. Exhibits in group show at Galerie Devambez, Paris. November: Miller's sister Viola arrives in Paris to study under him. Studio: 16 rue Boissonade.

1912

First one-man exhibition, April 1–20, at Macbeth Gallery, New York City. Corcoran Gallery of Art purchases *The Boudoir* (no longer in collection). Summers in St. Jean du Doigt, Brittany. Purchase of *The Chinese Statuette* by Metropolitan Museum of Art (now in collection of The Saint Louis Art Museum). Exhibits Cincinnati Museum (also 1913–1920, 1926–1927).

913

Syracuse Museum of Fine Arts purchases Mother and Child (now in private collection). Summers in St. Jean du Doigt. Elected Associate, National Academy of Design, New York City (NAD). Exhibits in group show at Macbeth Gallery (spring); Los Angeles Museum of History, Science and Art (opens November 6).
